## BIO

*My teaching, professional work, and academic research are focused on cultural landscapes, resilient design, and ecologically-centered community development from a global lens. In my teaching, I strive to expose students to the vast, interdisciplinary nature of landscape architecture and encourage them to apply their design skills towards issues they're passionate about. I believe landscape architects can play a pivotal role in ensuring a livable environment for future generations, and it is imperative that we mentor the next generation of landscape architects to follow their imaginations and push the boundaries of the field.*

*My research is focused on design in rural areas, and in 2020 I co-founded the Rural Futures Collaborative to bring together communities, designers, and their collaborators around rural issues. In 2024-2025, I received a CSU School of Global and Environmental Sustainability Resident Fellowship for my research on the future of agriculture in Colorado. This fellowship has allowed me to hire two landscape architecture student research assistants, who have generously shared their knowledge and skills. Outside of CSU, I serve on the board of the Refugee Collective in Austin, TX. As a board member and volunteer, I have helped to create a carbon farm plan and develop a path for a refugee-centered fibershed. I have brought lessons from this work into the classroom, sharing design iterations around carbon sequestration, processes for working with refugee and immigrant communities, and encouraging students to participate in community-based projects.*
